All varieties are vegan, certified as natural cosmetics (COSMOS Natural), and made without synthetic fragrances and mineral oils.

The Mixed Senses soap creation awakens the senses with its high-contrast, colourful design, special soap imprint and diverse fragrance compositions. The five varieties call to mind the sound of the sea (Ocean Sound), the citrusy flavour of summer (Taste of Summer), the spicy fragrances of an oriental bazaar (Oriental Scent), the sensation of a gentle hug (Warm Embrace) or a soothing, clear thought (Pure Mind).
